## Privacy Notice for Older Pupils (Years 7 and 8) - Key Information

This notice contains the key information about how and why we collect your personal data and what we do with it.

As you may know, the School is part of King's College, Cambridge (the **College**). This means that the College is ultimately responsible for how the School uses your personal data. However, if you have any questions about this, or about how your information is used, you can speak to your form tutor at School.

Personal data is information about you. For example, information about how well you are doing at School and any information that we need to take care of you. Photographs and videos of you also count as your personal data.

You can also obtain a copy of the full privacy notice by asking your parents to contact the School or by speaking to your form tutor.

The full version includes additional points, such as:

- further information on the purposes for which we use your personal data;
- for how long the School keeps your personal data; and
- our lawful bases for using your personal data.

The School uses your personal data in order to:

- Teach you and other pupils;
- Look after you and other people such as other pupils;
- Make sure that you and others are behaving properly;
- Make sure that the School complies with the law, is well managed and that we protect the School; and
- Advertise the School and tell people about the School and what we do here e.g. we may use photographs of you in our prospectus, on our website or in social media.

We set out below examples of the different ways in which we use your personal data and where that personal data comes from.

- Admissions forms give us a lot of personal data. We get information from you, your parents, your teachers and other pupils. Your old school also gives us information about you so that we can teach and care for you.
- Sometimes we get information from your doctors and other professionals where we need this to look after you.
- We may need to report some of your information to the government (e.g. the Department for Education). We will need to tell the local authority that you attend

the School, if you leave the School or let them know if we have any concerns about your welfare.

- We tell your parents or education guardian about how well you are doing at School. Where fair, we will also tell them about your behaviour.
- We may use photographs or videos of you for the School's website and social media sites or prospectus to show prospective pupils what we do here and to advertise the School. We may continue to use these photographs and videos after you have left the School. Sometimes we use photographs and videos for teaching purposes, for example, to record a drama lesson.
- We publish our sports fixtures and other news on the website to tell people about what we have been doing.
- We use CCTV to make sure the School site is safe. CCTV is not used in private areas such as changing rooms or toilets.
- We will send you information to keep you up to date with what is happening at the School. For example, by sending you information about events and activities taking place and the King's Messenger.
- We will keep details of your address when you leave so we can keep you updated about what is happening at the School, to tell you about events and activities and find out how you are getting on. We may also pass your details onto the alumni organisation which is called the King's College School Association (KCSA).

You have the following rights regarding your personal data:

- correction of personal data held;
- access to personal data held;
- deletion of personal data in certain circumstances;
- portability - the transfer of personal data to you or a third party;
- restriction of use of personal data; and
- the right to object to the use of personal data in certain circumstances.

These rights are explained in more detail in the full privacy notice, and your form tutor can give you more information.

If you have any questions about how we use your personal data, please speak to your form tutor. Alternatively, you can speak to your parents who will talk to us on your behalf.
