	3 vests (optional)

	2 pairs pyjamas – lighter weight ones required for the summer term
	2 sets of play clothes eg jeans, t-shirts, hoodies/jumpers
	1 pair play shoes/trainers (in addition to games pair)
	1 pair bedroom slippers (not slipper socks or mules)
	1 dressing gown/toweling bathrobe
	1 brush & 1 comb (named)
	1 sponge bag (named with loop)
	1 face flannel (named with loop)
	1 tube of toothpaste & toothbrush (both named)
	Optional deodorant – roll on type, <i>no aerosols allowed</i>
	2 bath towels with loop of tape in middle of long side (approx. 70 cm x 130 cm)
	1 lockable box for private items
	Spare name tapes – with child’s name (to be handed to Matron)
	Bedding (to remain at School for the year)
	1 duvet & pillow with protective pillowcase– synthetic washable, not feather (due to allergies)
	2 duvet covers and 2 pillowcases

Additional /different items required by Senior Probationers (Year 5, and when they start singing in Chapel) and Choristers

	For Chapel:
	8 pairs black socks
	1 smart pair black shoes in addition to school pair (standard soles only)
	1 collapsible black umbrella – named
	1 purple and white striped scarf (Michaelmas and Lent Terms)
	For tours:
	1 overnight case (approx. 20” x 14” / 50 cm x 35 cm) - clearly named on outside
	1 KCS (or similar) backpack - clearly named on outside
	Large-wheeled robust clearly named suitcase for Choir Tours to be brought to school prior to Tour (can double up as school suitcase and remain at school during term time)
	Supplied by Matron:
	4 Eton shirts – cost charged to termly bill
	1 black tie (ordered through Matrons) – cost charged to termly bill
	Eton wear for Chapel/Concerts provided by Matron and cost charged to King’s College except shirts and tie as above, usually from Year 6 or earlier if necessary

Notes:

- *When you arrive at the start of term, please take to the laundry room your school uniform, your second towel and your second set of bedding – put them in your drawers. Your underbed locker should be used for your underwear (socks, pants and vests), your play clothes, and additional items such as your scarf and umbrella.*
- *Most items of clothing are laundered on site. However, please don’t supply clothes that cannot be tumble dried, or which need to be ironed.*
- *Games kit for Choristers, Probationers and Weekly Boarders is washed weekly. Flexi boarders who*

board for only one or two nights will need to take their games kit home at the weekend.

- *School shirts and duvet covers are sent away for laundering – please ensure that you follow the guidelines for numbers to be supplied.*
- *Please label clothes with sewn in labels – ideally at the waistband or neck. All socks must be clearly named. Unnamed clothing is sent at the end of term to charity shops or (in the case of underwear) is thrown out – please help us to keep this to a minimum.*
- *Should Matron need to sew in a label, a charge of £2 will be added to your School bill.*
